M451: Decisive Action Advance Sheet

1. SCOPE:

Army forces conduct decisive and sustainable land operations through the simultaneous combination of offensive, defensive, and stability operations (or defense support of civil authorities) appropriate to the mission and environment. Army forces conduct regular and irregular warfare against both conventional and hybrid threats. This five-hour lesson enables the learner to analyze the environment and act quickly as decisions need to be made. At the end of this lesson the learner will be able to analyze the situation and select the correct action to employ based on the unique elements that are present.

2. LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Action: Analyze decisive action within the operating concept of unified land operations.

Condition: As a learner and senior leader attending face-to-face or virtual environments participating in dynamic, collaborative facilitated discussions, given references and multimedia resources.

Standard: Distinguish between the base operations order and the current operating picture, by:

- 1. Examining the operations order;
- 2. Analyzing the current operations picture;
- 3. Correlate the operations order with the common operating picture;
- 4. Examining Defense Support of Civil Authorities element; and
- 5. Showing large scale operations through the lens of all domains.

- (3) Exercise and enforce emotional intelligence (self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, social skill).
