MEMORANDUM FOR All NCO Academy Personnel

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum #5 – Fraternization

- 1. References:
  - a. AR 600-20, Army Command Policy
- b. TRADOC Regulation 350-6, Enlisted Initial Entry Training Policies and Administration
- 2. Fraternization between any staff or faculty member and anyone in a student status, regardless of the course of instruction, violates Army policies and is unacceptable. In addition, fraternization between any Soldier (permanent party, NCOA students, WOES students, or OES students) and a Soldier in Initial Entry Training is prohibited. This prohibition applies without regard to installation of assignment.

## 3. Fraternization includes:

- a. Relationships between Soldiers of different ranks when the relationship compromises or appears to compromise authority or the chain of command; causes actual or perceived partiality or unfairness; involves, or appears to involve, the improper use of rank for personal gain; are, or perceived to be exploitive or coercive in nature; creates an actual or predictable adverse impact on discipline, morale, or the ability of the command to accomplish its mission.
- b. Personal relationships between officers and enlisted, to include: ongoing business relationships; dating; shared living accommodations; intimate or sexual relationships; gambling.
- 4. This fraternization policy also applies to social networking sites, including but not limited to TikTok, Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), and Snapchat. NCOA cadre will not accept social media invitations from students before or during the course.
- 5. Engagements of a social nature between NCOA students and any of the following personnel is considered fraternization:
  - a. Initial Entry (AIT) students from the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps.

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- b. Any Army, Navy, or Marine Corps service member assigned as permanent party to the School of Music.
- 6. Prohibited activities with unauthorized personnel (both during and outside of the training day) include:
  - a. Going behind closed doors with them, for any reason.
  - b. Giving them a ride in your car, or accepting a ride in theirs.
  - c. Allowing them into your billets, or going into theirs.
  - d. Having social interaction with them, on- or off-base (movies, bars, clubs, etc.).
  - e. Eating with them at the dining facility or any restaurant.
- 7. The follow guidance applies to School of Music Staff in student status:
- a. Limit interactions with non-student School of Music faculty and staff to official course-related business only.
- b. Do not utilize the staff lounge or latrine, with the following exception: Students may utilize the staff locker room to shower after PRT.
- c. While in student status, avoid office spaces, studios, and other areas reserved for staff members.
- 8. The NCOA Deputy Commandant is the approval authority for exceptions to this policy. NCOA students may request exceptions to this policy by submitting a Special Request Form to their Small Group Leader. The Deputy Commandant will consult and coordinate with HHC, USASOM course managers, and others as appropriate before making a decision.
